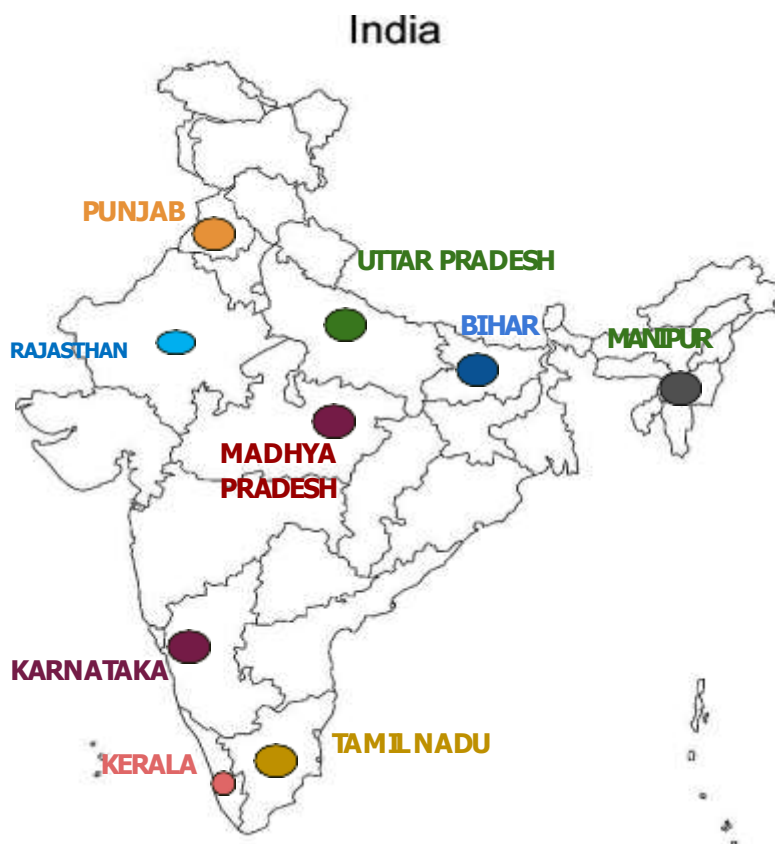


Skill Training under State Skill Missions

1. MADHYA PRADESH

- State skill mission in various states have been trying to make an impact through taking up innovative and socially relevant programme across states. some of the programme have been show case.
- Training programme for Rural Youth/women Spons. by National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) under OFDD Scheme, Madhya Pradesh Regional Office.
- NABARD is India's apex Development Bank, established in 1982 under an Act of Parliament to promote sustainable and equitable agriculture and rural development. It continues to aid in nation building through participative financial and non-financial interventions, innovations, technology and institutional development in rural areas.
- NABARD under Off-Farm Development Department (OFDD) scheme had sanctioned 120 candidates for short term 270 hours Sewing Machine Operator) SMO training programmes for the ATDC training centres, ATDC Bhopal, ATDC Indore, ATDC Chhindwara, and ATDC Jabalpur.
- In 45 days training candidates learnt Operations on Industrial Sewing Machine, Advance Sewing Machine, Concept of Measurement conversion, Garment Pattern Making, manufacturing and product development.
- Out of 120 candidates 90 candidates have been placed in wage employment in M/s Gokaldas Exports, M/s M 2 Textiles, M/s Apparel Pvt. Ltd., M/s. Jagdamba Garment Industry Pvt. Ltd., and rest of candidates have opted self-employment. ATDC has successfully completed the project and has received 100 % payment after 100% placement assistance of all 120 candidates.

2. TAMILNADU

This year the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC) had approved specific skilling programmes for Urban Poor Slum dwellers and the Jail inmates. Both these segments have been largely left out from the skilling arena due to the complexities involved in the skilling process and the varying results coming out of its execution.

(A.) Success of the Kannagi Nagar Slum Dwellers Programme.

- ATDC Kilpauk imparted special programme on Aari and Hand Embroidery programme for 3 months to 120 Urban Poor dwellers under the Schemes - Resettlements of Coovam River Projects / Rehabilitation of Slums where 23500 housing tenements at Kannagi Nagar through Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board (TNUHDB) under the sponsorship of Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation. In June 2023, about 58 students in two batches had completed the above programmes with intensive practical knowledge in Aari work and Hand Embroidery. 2D and 3D Aari work has been taught to them to have advance knowledge to them.
- After completion of Training the students started practicing the work and almost 60% to 70% students are getting small orders from Rs.1000/- to Rs.3000/-, out of which 10 to 15 students started earning from Rs.7000/- to 10000/- in a month for 2 to 3 garments This special programme has improved the life of Urban Poor Women a lot to gain financial freedom and time freedom to greater extent in generating an income to the family.

(B) Rehabilitation Skill Training for 20 convicted Prisoners, Central Prison – I, Puzhal. Chennai, Tamil Nadu

- ATDC, Kilpauk imparted Skill Training the Rehabilitation of 20 convicted Prisoners on Self Employed Tailor for 360 Hours sponsored by TNSDC on on side at Central Prison -1, Puzhal, Chennai.
