We had again approached REC Limited for training of 300 unemployed meritorious youth in 3 years B.Voc degree course. REC Limited has considered our project and given CSR assistance of Rs. 8.19 crore for "Learn and Earn – A REC Foundation Initiative" to impart bachelor's degrees to 300 youths in Apparel Manufacturing & Entrepreneurship (AME) and Fashion Design & Retail (FDR), over the period of three years, to be implemented by the Apparel Training and Design Centre in 12 locations Pan-India viz. Gurugram, Dwarka, Jaipur, Kanpur, Ranchi, Raipur, Mumbai, Surat, Kolkata, Imphal, Bangalore & Kannur.







Sh. Rakesh Vaid, Sr. Vice-Chairman ATDC and Dr. Vijay Mathur, DG&CEO, ATDC had met Sh. Vivek Kumar Dewangan, IAS, Chairman & Managing Director of REC Limited at Corporate office, Gurgaon and given perspective and role of ATDC. Dr. Neera Chandra, Director (CSR) and Dr. Gurpreet Kaur, Director (Academics Affairs) had provided valuable inputs to the projects at various application stages.



The above Project has been approved by the REC Foundation. REC Foundation is an initiative of REC Limited which is one of the leading Public Sector Enterprises of the Government of India under administrative control of the Ministry of Power.

REC Limited under its CSR Policy has provided the funds to support various foremost concerns of National Development by empowering economically and socially backward communities, differently abled youth etc. by contributing in education, creation of livelihood, eradication of poverty through skill development.

The project cost is Rs. 8.19 crore for conducting the above training at ATDC Centres in 12 locations of India viz. Gurugram, Dwarka, Jaipur, Kanpur, Ranchi, Raipur, Mumbai, Surat, Kolkata, Imphal, Bangalore & Kannur.

The project period is 36 months.



The Directorate of Handloom and Handicraft organized an enriching workshop and seminar on Traditional Potloi Making (Manipuri Bridal Dress) in celebration of the 10th National Handloom Day. Our students, alongside faculty members, participated actively in this insightful event. Renowned designers and experts shared their valuable knowledge, presenting their theses and showcasing various designs during the workshop.

One of the key highlights was the discussion on the symbolism behind the colors used in Potloi. The experts explained the significance of red, white, gold, and green as universal colors in the dress. The green blouse symbolizes the freshness, purity, and innocence of a girl or woman. The red Potloi, which represents the lower garment, signifies the girl or woman's role in carrying forward the bloodline of her husband. White stands for purity, while gold represents brightness, prosperity, and the light she brings to her husband's home.

The workshop sparked immense interest among the students, with many thoughtful questions arising throughout the session. In addition, the experts presented Potloi designs from different eras, including the 1920s, 1950s, 1990s, and 2000s, illustrating the evolution of this traditional attire over time.

It was a fascinating experience for everyone involved, deepening the understanding of the cultural significance and beauty of Potloi making.






SESSION ON THE TIE AND DYE


SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN CELEBRATIONS: INNOVATIVE CRAFT AND FASHION SHOWCASE.


